1. BACKGROUND

The Nelson Mandela Museum (NMM) is a not-for-profit institution established by the government of South Africa as an agency of the National Department of Sport, Arts and Culture. It was established as part of a portfolio of legacy projects that seek to transform the heritage landscape from our apartheid past. At the same time, it is a resource for promoting economic development through tourism in an impoverished region of the country. The museum primarily houses collections of gifts to the nation given by Nelson Mandela to the museum to share his legacy with the nation.

The mandate of the Nelson Mandela Museum is to preserve and promote the legacy of Nelson Mandela, and one of its main strategic goals is to improve the museum's public profile and access. This mandate is executed through the museum's two main facilities, the Qunu Youth and Heritage Centre and the Bhunga Building in Mthatha CBD. The Bhunga Building doubles as the administrative office of the museum. The Museum has been authorized by the Department of Sport, Arts, and Culture to administer the Ingquza Hill Museum in Flagstaff and the O.R. Tambo Garden of Remembrance in Bizana.

2. PURPOSE

 - (b) any other invitation for tender, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the lowest acceptable tender will be used to determine the applicable preference point system,

DECLARATION CERTIFICATE FOR LOCAL PRODUCTION AND CONTENT FOR DESIGNATED SECTORS

This Standard Bidding Document (SBD) must form part of all bids invited. It contains general information and serves as a declaration form for local content (local production and local content are used interchangeably).
